

Katie Beckett Letter of Medical Necessity

What is it?

Families in the Katie Beckett Part B program that have the Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) service must submit a Letter of Medical Necessity (LOMN) to justify purchases made for their child. The purpose of this LOMN is to **justify** and **explain how** the expense is treating the child's medical condition.

Simple, right? Wrong.

Inspira requires a Letter of Medical Necessity (LOMN) Form from the healthcare provider confirming the expenses are needed to treat a specific diagnosis. It must be completed by *child's physician or therapist, including - but not limited to - pediatrician, specialist, medical doctor, physician's assistant, licensed/registered nurse practitioner, and occupational/physical/speech therapist.*

Tips for completing the form:

- **Section A: Child's Information**

- Child's Name
- HRA Cardholder's Name (Parent/guardian)
- Child's SSN
- Employer Name: State of Tennessee Katie Beckett HRA

- **Section B: Treatment Recommendations (to be completed by Health Care Provider)**

- List ALL the child's medical conditions here
 - Example: Autism, Hypotonia, Sleep Apnea, etc.
- Recommended Treatment (select all that apply)
 - Includes a list of categories that the Health Care Provider can check off, however they still **must** provide additional detail in the empty box below.
 - The health care provider must list out in the empty box below:
 - What is the item?
 - What condition is it treating?
 - How will it treat the condition?
 - **Examples:**
 - **Sensory swing** for his **Autism** to treat his **gross motor development** and to advance **therapeutic goals**.
 - **Stroller wagon** for his **Autism and Hypotonia** due to **elopement and mobility concerns** to aid in community integration.

Tip: The provider **CAN** include multiple items on one form. If you do not have enough space to list everything out the provider can sign and date additional pages. ***BE SPECIFIC!!***

Once you think you are specific enough, **be even more specific.**

This LOMN is valid (choose this answer below):

For the duration of the time the child is receiving Katie Beckett, Part B services

Items that are frequently covered in the program by a LOMN:

- Non-traditional therapies such as: hippotherapy, music therapy, aquatic therapy, art therapy, Neurofeedback, etc.
- Diapers/wipes/formula
- Orthotics
- ABA therapy
- Sensory Items: such as swings, fidgets, etc.
- Communication devices/assistive technology
- Tablets (such as iPads), cases, headphones
- Specialized car seat/equipment
- WonderFold wagon
- School tuition, homeschool supplies, tutoring services
- Fence/security equipment for elopement risk
- AngelSense
- Pool for aquatic therapy
- Cubby Bed
- Vitamins, probiotics
- Specialty toothbrush
